1961 Jaguar XK150 at Vanderbilt

The William K. Vanderbilt II estate, home to the museum, is a landmark in automobile and racing history. In 1904, Vanderbilt, a pioneer American race driver, set a new land-speed record of 92.30 miles per hour in a Mercedes at a course in Daytona Beach, Florida.

That same year, he launched the Vanderbilt Cup, the first major trophy in American auto racing. The popular, international Vanderbilt Cup races drew drivers from around the world and were run on a famous course Vanderbilt established in Nassau County, Long Island.
